WORLD MEETING OF FAMILIES 2018

Tickets for the Closing Mass of WMOF2018 are now available for booking
on the WMOF2018 website. Tickets **are free** but you will need a ticket to gain
entry. Every adult and every child attending will need a ticket. Under 18s
must be accompanied by an adult. All tickets will be for standing sections.

The Closing Mass of WMOF2018 will take place in the Phoenix Park, Dublin,
one of the largest public city parks in Europe. The Mass will take place at
3:00 pm at the Papal Cross, right at the heart of the Park. A colour-coding
ticket system will be in place given the scale of the event, and each ticket will
give access both in and out of the Park via a single route and gate. Due to
the size and scale of this event, tickets for Phoenix Park will be issued to
pilgrims by email as a 'print at home' ticket. These will be sent by 31 July.

Prepare for your journey

- Allow yourself plenty of time to reach the venue. While there will be
walking involved, there will be rest areas along the route for your
comfort.
- Some walking is unavoidable due to the size, scale and location of this
event.
While this is a standing venue, you will be allowed to bring a small folding
chair with you. Further details on what is permitted will be updated
closer to the Final Mass date.
- Seek medical advice if you have any concerns about your ability to
participate in an event of this scale.

Plan your Transport

- Decide how you will travel to the Phoenix Park well in advance. You are
strongly advised to walk, take public or group transport (coach) to this
event.
- Public transport and coaches will be given priority and will bring you closest
to the Phoenix Park.
- It will not be possible to drive up to or near to the Phoenix Park by car.

A comprehensive transportation plan is being finalised and will provide
detailed information on all modes of transport shortly.

**Pope Francis, in Gaudete et Exsultate, his Apostolic Exhortation on
the call to holiness in today's world writes-**

100. I regret that ideologies lead us at times to two harmful errors. On the one
hand, there is the error of those Christians who separate these Gospel demands
from their personal relationship with the Lord, from their interior union with
him, from openness to his grace. Christianity thus becomes a sort of NGO
stripped of the luminous mysticism so evident in the lives of St Francis of Assisi,
St Vincent de Paul, St Teresa of Calcutta, and many others. For these great saints,
mental prayers, the love of God and the reading of the Gospel in no way detracted
from their passionate and effective commitment to their neighbours; quite the
opposite.
