**Pope Francis, in Gaudete et Exsultate, his Apostolic
Exhortation on the call to holiness in today's world writes-**

126. Christian joy is usually accompanied by a sense of humour. We see this clearly, for example, in Saint Thomas More, Saint Vincent de Paul and Saint Philip Neri. Ill humour is no sign of holiness. "Remove vexation from your mind" (*Eccl* 11:10). We receive so much from the Lord "for our enjoyment" (*1 Tim* 6:17), that sadness can be a sign of ingratitude. We can get so caught up in ourselves that we are unable to recognise God's gifts.[\[101\]](#)

127. With the love of a father, God tells us: "My son, treat yourself well... Do not deprive yourself of a happy day" (*Sir* 14:11.14). He wants us to be positive, grateful and uncomplicated: "In the day of prosperity, be joyful... God created human beings straightforward, but they have devised many schemes" (*Eccl* 7:14.29). Whatever the case, we should remain resilient and imitate Saint Paul: "I have learned to be content with what I have" (*Phil* 4:11). Saint Francis of Assisi lived by this; he could be overwhelmed with gratitude before a piece of hard bread, or joyfully praise God simply for the breeze that caressed his face.

**Be part of the distribution of Holy Communion team at the Papal Mass
in the Phoenix Park on Sunday August 26th**

In the Gospel of Matthew, chapter 14:13-21, we read how Jesus fed the five thousand. Jesus "blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds." It looks likely that we will have as many as 500,000 present for the final Mass of the World Meeting of Families 2018 at which Pope Francis will be our principal celebrant.

We are seeking the generous help of around 4,000 ministers of Holy Communion to volunteer for one day to be Christ's disciples helping to give the Bread of Life to the people at this historic Papal Mass. This is open to any of those who are already trained and assisting with the distribution of Holy Communion in their own parishes. We are looking for the help of lay people, priests, deacons and religious Ministers of Holy Communion.

Those volunteering need to **be already trained and functioning ministers of Holy Communion** in your own parish community. You will need to be **steady on your feet**. Although there will be some plastic tracking laid down, much of the distribution will be done in the grassy corrals of the Phoenix Park Papal Mass site. You will need to be **garda vetted** for this event, even though you have been vetted for this ministry in your own parish [if you are already Garda vetted for WMOF2018, that suffices].

You will **need to be in the Phoenix Park by 10:30am on Sunday 26th August** so as to be walked through how and where you will minister. It may not be possible for you to be assigned to minister in the place where your family or fellow parishioners are situated, but we hope this won't put you off generously stepping up to help with this important task. And we will do our best to keep parish groups working together.
