Archbishop Farrell in his recent Pastoral Letter **Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor** reminds us ‘we are at a critical moment as a global community and so I wish to encourage all people of faith to embark on this journey to live our call to protect and care for the garden of the world. Each one of us can play our own part in changing our collective response to the unprecedented threat of climate change.’

Reducing your food waste is one of the most effective actions you can take to help fight climate change. Any step you take to reduce your waste has the potential to cause significant effects. The thing is, wasted food represents the waste of all sorts of emissions and environmental impacts from across the food chain – everything that was done to grow, prepare and transport the food. And in Ireland, we waste a lot of food, over 1 million tonnes a year! Here are some of the things you can do, it really is small steps for big impact!

Four Ways to Reduce Food Waste

- 1. Make a meal plan.** Getting into the habit of planning your meals is a sure-fire way to avoid unintended food waste. Many of us have started doing this over the past year due to restrictions. Let’s keep it up for the planet!
- 2. Check your stocks before you go shopping.** Take an extra minute to double-check what you already have in the kitchen before heading to the shops. This will help to avoid accidental double-ups and might give you ideas for what you could buy to help use existing ingredients up.
- 3. Write a shopping list.** Simple but definitely effective. A less simple step is sticking to the list!
- 4. Freeze!** If plans change or you cook too much, the freezer is brilliant tool to help save your food. You can freeze food right up to its use by date.

St. Laurence O’Toole

The Archbishop of Dublin has given permission to celebrate the Feast of St. Laurence O’Toole, Principal Patron of the Dublin Archdiocese this Sunday in lieu of the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

St Laurence O’Toole (Lorcán Ó Tuathail) was born in Castledermot, Co. Kildare in 1128. He became Abbot of Glendalough in 1153 and Archbishop of Dublin in 1162. He died in Eu in Normandy on the 14th of November 1180 and was canonised in 1225
