Extracts from the Letter from the Archbishop of Dublin, Dermot Farrell

Dear Father,

I am writing to you today regarding the return of our congregations to regular attendance at Sunday Mass and to ask that a Summer Dues collection be taken up again this year in support of priests.

The Summer Dues, introduced last summer, helped somewhat to address the financial challenges faced by priests. This initiative was very successful. There is, however, still a 30% drop in the First Collection in the first four months of 2022 compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, which we must try to rectify.

In these Circumstances, I am proposing that each parish would invite the faithful to contribute a summer offering again this year, launching on the weekend of 19th June. Your continued generosity would be most welcome.

This is an appropriate time, too, to remind parishioners of the value of coming together as a community to celebrate the Lord's Day. We are formed in our Christian life by our participation in the Sunday Eucharist and missioned there to go out, in company with the Risen Lord, to be good news in a world much in need of the hope we carry with us. While the webcam and other technological supports were most helpful during the pandemic, and have their place now too, it is time to re-establish Sunday Mass as the source and summit of our Christian commitment, and of communion with the Lord and with each other.

Parish Finance Committee

As has been reported in previous Newsletters, the Parish Finance Committee has been considering the possible renovation of the Parish Centre. Quotations were received from 3 builders and the Committee have met with our Architect on 2 occasions seeking clarification of the costs involved. At a meeting on Tuesday, 31st May, the Committee decided that in view of (a) the exorbitant quotes received and (b) the likely increase in costs due to inflationary trends, material and labour shortages, not to proceed with the renovation work at this time.

Gratitude was extended to Mrs Monica Heade who is retiring from the Committee after many years of faithful service. Also for her work on the Parish Hall Committee, Hospitality functions in the Parish and the Parish Lotto.

BUILDING HOPE
